Today's Focus

The Prayer of the Day sets the tone for the Sunday: the ancient foe warred on mankind in the garden, but God promised to send a champion to battle on our behalf. The Second Adam came to do what the first could not, and in the desert the battle was joined. But for us fights the valiant one whom God himself elected...he holds the field forever. (Hymn of the Day)

OPENING HYMN

CONFESSION OF SINS

- L: During this season of Lent, we are taken back to Jerusalem where our Savior paid the price for our sins by dying on the cross. There he completely forgave the entire debt that we owed for the sins that we had committed. Let us join now to lay our sins at the foot of his cross.
- C: With broken heart and contrite sigh, A trembling sinner, Lord, I cry. Your pard'ning grace is rich and free—O God, be merciful to me!

I smite upon my troubled breast, With deep and conscious guilt oppressed, Christ and his cross my only plea—O God, be merciful to me!

(Christian Worship Hymn 303; st 1, 2)

ABSOLUTION OF SINS

L: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

L: Let us pray...

Lord our strength, the battle of good and evil rages within and around us, and our ancient foe tempts us with his deceits and empty promises. Keep us steadfast in your Word, and when we fall, raise us up again and restore us through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

FIRST LESSON

Genesis 2:7-9, 15-17; 3:1-7

⁷ the LORD God formed the man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being. ⁸ Now the LORD God had planted a garden in the east, in Eden; and there he put the man he had formed. ⁹ And the LORD God made all kinds of trees grow out of the ground—trees that were pleasing to the eye and good for food. In the middle of the garden were the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil… ¹⁵ The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. ¹⁶ And the LORD God commanded the man, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; ¹⁷ but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die."…

¹ Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden'?"

- ² The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden, ³ but God did say, 'You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die."
- ⁴ "You will not surely die," the serpent said to the woman. ⁵ "For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."
- ⁶ When the woman saw that the fruit of the tree was good for food and pleasing to the eye, and also desirable for gaining wisdom, she took some and ate it. She also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. ⁷ Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made coverings for themselves. PSALM OF THE DAY

Out of the depths I cry to you, O LORD; O Lord, hear my voice.

SECOND LESSON

Romans 5:12-19

¹² Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all men, because all sinned— ¹³ for before the law was given, sin was in the world. But sin is not taken into account when there is no law. ¹⁴ Nevertheless, death reigned from the time of Adam to the time of Moses, even over those who did not sin by breaking a command, as did Adam, who was a pattern of the one to come. *Continued on next page*

¹⁵ But the gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died by the trespass of the one man, how much more did God's grace and the gift that came by the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, overflow to the many! ¹⁶ Again, the gift of God is not like the result of the one man's sin: The judgment followed one sin and brought condemnation, but the gift followed many trespasses and brought justification. ¹⁷ For if, by the trespass of the one man, death reigned through that one man, how much more will those who receive God's abundant provision of grace and of the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man, Jesus Christ.

¹⁸ Consequently, just as the result of one trespass was condemnation for all men, so also the result of one act of righteousness was justification that brings life for all men. ¹⁹ For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous. (NIV 1984)

VERSE OF THE DAY

Matthew 4:10b

L: It is written: "Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only."

GOSPEL Matthew 4:1-11

¹ Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. ² After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. ³ The tempter came to him and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread."

⁴ Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God."'

⁵ Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. ⁶ "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down. For it is written: "He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone."

⁷ Jesus answered him, "It is also written: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.""

- ⁸ Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. ⁹ "All this I will give you," he said, "if you will bow down and worship me."
- ¹⁰ Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only."
- ¹¹ Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him. (NIV 1984)


APOSTLES' CREED

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY



- L: The peace of the Lord be with you always.





As congregation of this synod, we strive to be a family where God is glorified and his saving message is shared with all people. We don't claim to be the only saving church, but we do strive to preserve and pass on the truth as it's found in the Bible. We at Tree of Life believe and teach that...

- 1. The Bible is the inspired Word of God, with no mistakes and no errors, his unchanging message to all people of all times: "Men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." (2 Peter 1:21)
- 2. God created people holy and without sin, but by their own choice they disobeyed God and brought sin upon the whole human race: "Sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all men, because all sinned." (Romans 5:12)
- 3. The final result of sin is not only the end of our earthly life, but eternal death and separation from God in the agony of hell:
 - "The wages of sin is death." (Romans 6:23)
- 4. The main and central message of the Bible is the gospel the good news that:

 "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him will not perish, but has eternal life." (John 3:16)
- 5. Jesus lived a perfect, sinless life in the place of every human being, and Jesus suffered the punishment of hell for the whole human race when he died on the cross: "The gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23)
- God the Holy Spirit creates and strengthens saving faith in Jesus Christ through the message about him in the Bible, in Baptism, and in the Lord's Supper:
 "Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the words of Christ." (Romans 10:17)
- 7. Christians do good works, not in order to earn a place in heaven, but out of love and thanks to God who has already given them eternal life as a free gift through Jesus: "I run in the path of your commands, for you have set my heart free." (Psalm 119:32)
- 8. Christians will want to gather together regularly around the Word of God for the strengthening of their own trust in Jesus and for encouraging each other in the faith: "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another, and all the more as you see the (final) Day approaching." (Hebrews 10:25)
- 9. Christians want to carry out the Lord's great commission to spread the good news about Jesus to others: "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation." (Mark 16:15)
- 10. When the Lord returns in judgment on the last day, he will raise all the dead and give the full glory of everlasting life in heaven to all who trusted in him as Savior:
 - "When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory." (Colossians 3:4)
